PROCESS FOR LEGISLATIVE PUBLIC HEARINGS

A "legislative" public hearing is typically held on matters which affect the general welfare of the entire City rather than a specific piece of property.

- 1. The Mayor opens the public hearing and identifies the subject.
- 2. A staff member presents the staff report.
- 3. Public testimony is taken.
- 4. The Council then asks questions of staff, the applicant or any member of the public who testified.
- 5. When the Council has finished its questions, the Mayor closes the public hearing.
- 6. When the public hearing is closed, Council will then deliberate to a decision and a motion will be made to either approve, deny, or "continue" the public hearing.

PROCESS FOR QUASI-JUDICIAL PUBLIC HEARINGS

A "quasi-judicial" public hearing is typically held for annexations, planning district changes, variances, conditional use permits, comprehensive plan changes, and appeals from subdivisions, partitions and architectural review.

- 1. The Mayor opens the public hearing and identifies the case to be considered.
- 2. A staff member presents the staff report to the Council.
- 3. Public testimony is taken:
 - a) In support of the application
 - b) In opposition or neutral
- 4. The Council then asks questions of staff, the applicant or any member of the public who testified.
- 5. When the Council has finished its questions, the Mayor closes the public hearing.
- 6. When the public hearing is closed, Council will then deliberate to a decision and a motion will be made to either approve, approve with conditions or deny the application, or "continue" the public hearing.

TIME LIMITS

The purpose of time limits on public hearing testimony is to provide all interested persons with an adequate opportunity to present and respond to testimony. All persons providing testimony **shall be limited to 10 minutes**, subject to the right of the Mayor to amend or waive the time limits.

EXECUTIVE SESSION INFORMATION

Executive session is a portion of the Council meeting that is closed to the public to allow the Council to discuss certain confidential matters. No decisions are made in Executive Session. The City Council must return to the public session before taking final action.

The City Council may go into Executive Session under the following statutory provisions to consider or discuss: *ORS* 192.660(2)(a) the employment of personnel; *ORS* 192.660(2)(b) the dismissal or discipline of personnel; *ORS* 192.660(2)(d) labor relations; *ORS* 192.660(2)(e) real property transactions; *ORS* 192.660(2)(f) non-public information or records; *ORS* 192.660(2)(g) matters of commerce in which the Council is in competition with other governing bodies; *ORS* 192.660(2)(h) current and pending litigation issues; *ORS* 192.660(2)(i) employee performance; *ORS* 192.660(2)(j) investments; or *ORS* 192.660(2)(m) security issues. **All discussions within this session are confidential**. Therefore, nothing from this meeting may be disclosed by those present. News media representatives are allowed to attend this session (unless it involves labor relations), but shall not disclose any information discussed during this session.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Annually the Oregon Liquor Control Commission (OLCC) requires all liquor licenses be renewed. According to the provisions of City Ordinance No. 680-85, establishing procedures for liquor license applicants, applicants are required to fill out a City application form, from which a review by the Police Department is conducted, according to standards and criteria established in Section 6 of the ordinance. The liquor license renewal applications are in accordance with all ordinances and the Police Department has conducted reviews of the applications.

According to the provisions of Section 5 of Ordinance No. 680-85 a member of the Council or the public may request a public hearing on any of the liquor license renewal requests. If such a public hearing request is made, a hearing will be scheduled and held on the license. It is important that any request for such a hearing include reasons for said hearing.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

A renewal fee of \$35 has been paid by each applicant.

ISSUE BEFORE THE COUNCIL:

City Council consideration on adopting a resolution to update the City of Tualatin Fee Schedule.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- This proposal is to amend the City of Tualatin Fee Schedule in order to establish or increase the following fees:

Administration Department

Passport Photo

Operations Department (formerly under Parks & Recreation Department)

Street Tree and Installation (Single Family Only)

Tree for Fee Program

- There are no applicable criteria to apply to this request.
- The City has general government authority to cover the costs of providing services and documents, as set forth by applicable Oregon Revised Statutes.

OUTCOMES OF DECISION:

Approval of the fee schedule amendment will result in the following:

- 1. Affected fees will be increased;
- 2. All other fees will remain unchanged;
- 3. The changes will become effective March 1, 2008.
- 4. Resolution No. 4675-07 will be rescinded effective March 1, 2008, in order that the existing Fee Schedule will be replaced with the new Fee Schedule.

Denial of the fee schedule amendment will result in the following:

1. There will be no change to the existing City of Tualatin Fee Schedule.

ALTERNATIVES TO RECOMMENDATION:

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

When the City collects fees identified in this staff report, they are deposited into various accounts that are identified as "revenue" in the City of Tualatin Budget. The City's current FY 2007-08 revenue projections for the accounts impacted by this proposed fee update are listed in the table below. The anticipated effect of the proposed fee adjustments on each of these revenue accounts is presented in the right-hand column of the table:

DISCUSSION:

The City has functioned as a Passports Acceptance Agency since August 2003. In this process, applicants for passports are required to provide two photographs with the application materials. The applicants are required to obtain these photos. To provide better service for passports, the City is proposing to provide a photo service. In surveying other agencies that provide passport services, including photos found that the average fee charged for photo service is \$15 (City of Lake Oswego \$15; City of Tigard

\$10; Clackamas County \$15; Dundee Post office \$15; Wilsonville Post Office \$15; Hillsboro Post Office \$15). The City of Tualatin is proposing to charge \$15 for this service.

The City Council on September 24, 2007 conducted a work session on street tree planting, removal and planting. The discussion was part of the City Council's Goal #1 to Enhance Sense of Place and City Beautification. In the presentation, City Council discussed the Tree-for-a-Fee program and the costs to plant street trees as part of a residential subdivision development. The Tree-for-a-Fee program began in 1996. The program allows a property owner to request the City to plant a street tree in the planting strip in front of their property for a cost of \$35. City Council concluded that even though the cost of the City planting a tree ranges from \$130 - \$186, the program is beneficial to enhance the streetscape in residential areas, and the cost should not increase to full cost recovery. The City Council provided direction to increase the fee to \$45 from the current \$35.

In the discussion on street tree planting as part of subdivisions and partitions, where the developer is required to deposit funds with the City and the City then plants the street trees after a home is constructed in the subdivision or partition, the City Council was briefed that the cost of tree planting ranges from \$130 for bare root stock to \$186 for balled and burlaped stock. The consensus of the City Council was to increase the fee to be full cost recovery. In follow-up discussions with the City's Operations Department on tree stock availability, it was concluded that the City's cost would be \$175 for each tree. This increases the fee from the current \$68.

IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

ISSUE BEFORE THE COMMISSION:

Whether the Tualatin City Council should adopt a resolution accepting Deeds of Dedication and Slope/Utility Easements as part of the SW Herman Road Improvement Project.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the City Council adopt the attached resolution.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- This action is not a public hearing.
- The Fiscal Year 07/08 Leveton Tax Increment District Project Fund contains a capital project to design roadway improvements, and acquire rights-of-way and easements for the SW Herman Road Improvement Project.
- The project area consists of SW Herman Road from SW Teton Avenue to 124th Avenue.
- This public improvement project is funded by the Tualatin Development Commission ("Commission") from SW 108th Avenue to SW 124th Avenue. The City is funding improvements from SW Teton Avenue to SW 108th Avenue.
- The primary purpose of constructing the roadway is to better facilitate freight mobility and industrial traffic flow within the District and to improve storm water drainage as well as overall roadway conditions.
- As part of the project, rights-of-way acquisition and utility, slope, and permanent easements have been identified.

- The acceptance of the Deed of Dedications and Easements are conditioned on the Commission at their February 25, 2008 meeting adopting a resolution authorizing compensation for the Deed of Dedications and Easements for the amounts noted in the attached documents.
- The Commission at its August 13, 2007 meeting directed the acquisition of rightsof-ways and easements.
- The documents to be accepted are from the following:
 - Hageman Development, Inc. and Hageman Properties. (Deeds of Dedication and Slope/Utility Easements).
- The Deed of Dedications and Easements are being presented to the Council for acceptance because the subject project is for a public street improvement and the Commission does not accept these types of documents.
- There are no criteria to apply to this request.

OUTCOMES OF DECISION:

Approval of the request to accept Deed of Dedications and Easements will result in the following:

- 1. Allow the Commission to obtain the rights-of-way and easements needed to construct roadway improvements.
- 2. Allow the SW Herman Road Improvement Project to maintain its current timeline.

Denial of the request to accept Deed of Dedications and Easements will result in the following:

- 1. The project will be delayed.
- 2. The Commission will need to decide whether or not to renegotiate right-of-way and easement acquisition costs.

ALTERNATIVES TO RECOMMENDATION:

Alternatives evaluated to acceptance of Deed of Dedications and Easements are as follows:

- 1. Renegotiate right-of-way and easement need and acquisition costs with current property owners.
- 2. Put project on hold.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

Compensation for the Deed of Dedications and Easements were addressed by the Commission at their February 25, 2008 meeting and is not applicable to acceptance of these documents. The Commission is paying for document recording.

PROJECT

ISSUE BEFORE THE COUNCIL:

Whether the Council should adopt a resolution authorizing commencement of negotiations to acquire an easement as part of the Killarney Lane Sewer and Water Project.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Council adopt the attached resolution.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- This action is not a public hearing.
- The Fiscal Year 07/08 Sewer and Water Operating Funds contain a capital project to construct water and sewer improvements and acquire an easement for the Killarney Lane Sewer & Water project.
- This project will construct a sewer line and remove the existing septic tanks and connect the residents to the sewer system and replace the existing water line in Killarney Lane.
- Before proceeding with the next stage of this project, the Council needs to authorize the resolution to allow commencement of negotiations to acquire an easement.
- One easement is required to reach the existing sewer line north of SW Killarney Lane
- There are no criteria to apply to this request.

OUTCOMES OF DECISION:

Approval of the request to authorize commencement of negotiations to acquire an easement will result in the following:

- 1. Allow the City to begin negotiations with property owners for an easement needed to construct sewer improvements.
- 2. Allow the Killarney Lane Sewer and Water Project to maintain its current timeline.

Denial of the request to authorize commencement of negotiations to acquire easements will result in the following:

1. The project will need to be put on hold.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The Sewer Operating Fund is budgeted at \$800,000 for constructing the sewer improvements.

RESOLUTION NO. 4759-08

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ACQUISITION OF AN EASEMENT FOR THE KILLARNEY LANE SEWER AND WATER PROJECT

WHEREAS the City of Tualatin ("City") is authorized by Oregon law to acquire real property by purchase where the acquisition is necessary for a public purpose; and

WHEREAS Section 13.010 of the Tualatin Development Code indicates the need for the City to implement sewer improvements to ensure adequate facilities for the community; and

WHEREAS City has funding in the Sewer and Water Operating Funds to construct the Killarney Lane Sewer and Water improvements; and

WHEREAS it appears to the Council that acquisition of an easement over the property described in the exhibits is necessary and in the public interest in order to construct the sewer and water improvements; and

WHEREAS the Council finds it necessary to authorize commencement of negotiations to acquire the property described in the exhibits to carry out the provisions of the Tualatin Development Code and constructing this project.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TUALATIN, OREGON, that:

Section 1. The Council finds that it is necessary, required and in the public interest for the purposes of sewer and water improvements to complete the Killarney Lane Sewer and Water improvements within the City, that the interests in real property, described in the exhibits be acquired by negotiation. The proposed improvements have been planned and located in the manner that will be most compatible with the greatest public good and the least private injury.

Section 2. The property acquired permanently by the City for construction of the sewer improvements shall be an easement.

Section 3. The City Attorney is authorized and directed to negotiate on behalf of the City with the property owner or owners for the acquisition of such property or to cause such negotiation to occur. The City Attorney shall follow applicable provisions of the State of Oregon, Department of Transportation, Right-of-Way Manual, as amended, in determining the value of properties being acquired and negotiating the acquisition.



ISSUE BEFORE THE COUNCIL:

Council will consider approval of Change Order No. 2 to the construction of the Library/City Offices Expansion and Remodel Project.

RECOMMENDATION:

Approve the attached Change Order No. 2 and authorize the City Manager to execute said Change Order No. 2.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- The Construction Manager/General Contractor (CM/GC) contract was awarded to P& C Construction Company of Gresham, Oregon on October 9, 2006, and the Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) in the amount of \$7,148,798 was approved on May 14, 2007. Change Order no. 1 increased the GMP to \$7,365,089.
- This change order increases the GMP by \$86,540 for work that was not included in the original scope of work (as described on the attached Change Order No. 2) and brings the new GMP to \$7,451,629.
- The contract time will be increased by zero (0) days as a result of this change order. The project remains on schedule for substantial completion no later than September 1, 2008.

OUTCOMES OF DECISION:

Authorization of this change order will enable the project to continue on schedule and within budget.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The new GMP is 4 percent above the original GMP. The revised total is within the amounts available for this project in the Library Improvements Fund, City Center Remodel Fund, and Central Urban Renewal Projects Fund.

There continue to be reasonable contingency funds relative to the progress of the project, however use of the remaining funds will require close attention.

ISSUE BEFORE THE COUNCIL:

The Council will accept the 2007 Annual Report of the Tualatin Library Advisory Committee (TLAC).

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1) Accept the annual report, and
- 2) Continue to support the library with designated library revenues from Washington and Clackamas counties, and the General Fund contributions that enable the city to provide outstanding library services to meet community expectations in the new library.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- Since the committee made its last annual report to council in March 2007, the library project has progressed from near completion of final design to past the mid-point of construction. In March the library was operating in the old building and now it has operated at the temporary location on Nyberg Street for about 10 months.
- Over the past year, TLAC has continued its involvement with various aspects of the new library and provided valuable comments and perspectives on the

building design, floor plan, and furniture, and will continue to do so through completion of the project.

- In the coming months, the committee will make recommendations on policies that need to be amended and/or created before the new library opens, recommend revision of its charter responsibilities and assist library staff in identifying opportunities in the new facility to expand programs, services and events for the community. Two members of the Committee will serve on the Ad Hoc Library Art Selection Committee.
- The Committee will seek ways to ensure funding that is adequate to allow the library to realize its expanded potential and to provide the outstanding library services expected by the Tualatin community. To this end, the committee will increase efforts to create a Tualatin Public Library Foundation under the auspices of the Oregon Community Foundation that will encourage endowments and gifts to meet the ongoing financial needs of the library and to provide a measure of security during downturns in the economy. In addition, the committee fully supports the Council's endorsement of the Clackamas County Commission to propose a new Clackamas County Library District.
- Each month the library staff updated the TLAC on library activities which this past year included selecting a temporary location and moving. The Committee was also kept up to date on staffing changes, events and Washington County Cooperative Library Services programs, and the proposed new Clackamas County Library District. The committee was updated on one complaint and the satisfactory follow up with the patron by staff.
- The committee was fortunate this year to have a member closely involved in the Tualatin Tomorrow visioning process and so received continuous information about that city-wide visioning process. The TLAC is identified in the implementation plan as a lead partner for some Tualatin Tomorrow action items that relate to the library. Another Committee member is also a member of the Board of the Friends of the Tualatin Library so the Committee was kept apprised of the activities of the Friends group that provided the library with over \$4,266 this year for Cultural Passes, programs, and books for children.
- Members of the TLAC wish to recognize and thank the City Council for going forward with the library expansion. The Committee also wishes to acknowledge the Council's consistent support of the library through the years with adequate and stable funding for its operations.

The Tualatin Library Advisory Committee (TLAC) was established by Ordinance 758-88, adopted by Council on October 10, 1988 and incorporated into the Tualatin Municipal Code as Chapter 1-25.

The role of the TLAC is to consult with and advise the Library Manager, make recommendations to the City Council, and hear and consider complaints about City Library policies and materials. The committee consists of seven members appointed by Council. The Library Manager provides the TLAC with staff support. The TLAC meets monthly or more often as needed.

Members of the 2007 TLAC were: Frank Bubenik (Chairperson through November), Marge Congress (Chairperson as of December)), Marissa Houlberg, Jo McGeorge (through September), Terry Novak, Elizabeth (Tibby) O'Brien, Alexander Pierce and Jim Shorr (through September). There is currently one vacancy.

The Tualatin Public Library Advisory Committee last reported to the City Council on March 26, 2007.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The TLAC strongly supports providing sufficient operating funds for the expanded library when it opens in the spring of 2008. Increased use of the new facility will place increased demands on the staff and collection. The TLAC therefore recommends that the Council maintain the level of service support currently provided for the library for fiscal year 2008/2009.

Whether to approve or deny a claim for property compensation or a waiver of "...Tualatin City Zoning and Development Code for which the Claimants waiver back to date of acquisition;" and "...waiver of all similar provisions of the City's Comprehensive Plan adapted after the date of acquisition." The properties are identified as:

- 19150 SW 90th Avenue (Lot #2) (Tax Lot 2100 on Assessor's Map 2S1 23D),
- 19190 SW 90th Avenue (Lots #4 & 5) (Tax Lots 2400 and 2401 on Assessor's Map 2S1 23D),
- 8505-8845 SW Tualatin-Sherwood Road (Lots #6, 7, & 8) (Tax Lot 2600 on Assessor's Map 2S1 23D),

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends the City Council deny the Claimant's request that the claim be "...put on indefinite hold" and consider the Staff's recommendation for a 6 month continuance and direct staff to continue the hearing to August 25, 2008.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The claim is a Measure 37 property compensation claim subject to Oregon Revised Statutes (ORS) 197.352 and the City of Tualatin Measure 37 Real Property Compensation Claim provisions in Tualatin Municipal Code (TMC) Chapter 12. The claim is also subject to Measure 49 approved by Oregon Voters in November, 2007. This measure limits Measure 37 claims to allowing 3-10 houses to be built under certain circumstances, but no longer allows claims for commercial or industrial uses.

On April 2, 2007, the Claimant requested a 180-day continuance of the April 23, 2007 hearing date, which City Council approved, and the hearing was continued to October 8, 2007. On September 7, 2007, the Claimant requested a second 180-day continuance and the hearing was continued to February 25, 2008.

In response to letters from the Community Development Department notifying the applicant of the enactment of Measure 49 and requesting notification that the applicant wishes to move forward with the claim or withdraw the claim, the applicant submitted a letter (Attachment B) dated January 24, 2008 requesting "...please put this claim on indefinite hold". Because the Council's consideration of the M37-06-01 matter is conducted in a public hearing, granting a continuance must be to a date certain. Because Measure 49 has provisions restricting Measure 37 claims in process, M37-06-01 is not a matter to put on indefinite hold. Given the claimant's request for additional time for the disposition of the case in light of Measure 49, Staff recommends denying the indefinite hold on M37-06-01 and granting a 6 month continuance to August 25, 2008.

ISSUE BEFORE THE COUNCIL:

This is a public hearing to accept testimony on the proposed renaming of the section of SW Boones Ferry Road located east of 65th Avenue and south of Lower Boones Ferry Road in Clackamas County.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends Council accept public testimony on this matter and direct the preparation of an ordinance renaming a portion of SW Boones Ferry Road in Clackamas County to SW McEwan Road.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- The proposed street name change will eliminate the current confusion of what is the correct street name in this area. Washington County Consolidated Communication Agency (WCCCA) raised the issue of eliminating the street name confusion for quick emergency response. The Clackamas County emergency response agency, C-COM, supports this change.
- Prior to the I-5 freeway interchange being constructed, Lower Boones Ferry Road (Market Road 13) ran straight from the Upper Boones Ferry Road/Boones Ferry Road intersection in Tualatin, east to the railroad tracks that are now the city limit lines between Tualatin and Lake Oswego. When the interchange was built, the existing section of road in Washington County between I-5 and 65th Avenue was renamed SW McEwan Road. The existing piece of road in

Clackamas County between 65th Avenue and its merge back into the new alignment of Lower Boones Ferry Road was named SW Boones Ferry Road (to match up with Lake Oswego dropping "Lower" from the street name).

On this short section of street between 65th Avenue and the merge, the businesses are using both Lower Boones Ferry Road and McEwan Road in their addresses. This causes confusion for customers since at least one of the buildings cannot be seen from the traveled Lower Boones Ferry Road. The manager of The Little Gym stated that the on-line map services do not show this section of street and he has to tell customers to turn left at McEwan Road so that they will find his business.

- This street name change is needed to match up the legal street names with the physical locations of the streets. This will assist response to emergency calls.
- A letter and copy of the Notice of Hearing were mailed out to the effected property owners and the businesses adjacent to this section of street.



ISSUE BEFORE THE COUNCIL:

The Council will consider adopting a resolution in support of a Clackamas County order to initiate the formation of the Clackamas County Library Service District (the "Proposed Library District").

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Council consider the attached resolution and determine if it is in the City's best interest to be included within the boundaries of the Proposed Library District.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

- Clackamas County staff will present a brief overview of the Proposed Library District and answer Council questions at the Council meeting.
- Formation of the Proposed Library District requires a vote and Clackamas County plans to place the measure on the November 4, 2008 ballot for voters living in Clackamas County.
- The Clackamas County Commission is pursuing formation of the Proposed Library District due to a pending reduction or possible elimination of the Federal Secure rural Schools funding and has other urgent issues such as creating more detention capacity. The Commission has indicated its intention to cease funding the three County operated libraries beginning in July 2009 and to phase out funding to city libraries over the next five years. Once County library funding has ceased, cities will pick up the difference, reduce services, or close libraries.

- It is suggested that the Proposed Library District will be better positioned to provide fair and sustainable funding for the city libraries within Clackamas County and create a mechanism to recognize that the city libraries service residents of the county outside the city boundaries as well as their citizens. The County has designated service areas for each library (see maps within Attachment A). The service areas are intended to define where people are most likely to receive library service, and to give the cities the ability to meet the library threshold standards designated within the Cooperative Intergovernmental Agreement.
- Council last discussed the Proposed Library District on October 8, 2007. At that time, Council directed staff to request that Clackamas County modify the Proposed Library District Service Area maps and tax revenue reimbursement formula to show Tualatin as the library service provider for all of the area within Tualatin's Urban Growth Boundary that is located within Clackamas County, and to endeavor to do the same for the unincorporated area east of Tualatin, south of the Tualatin River and north of I205 since the Tualatin library is about ½ mile from the Clackamas County boundary (65th Avenue) and the Lake Oswego and West Linn libraries are 6 and 8 miles away from the Clackamas County portion of Tualatin.

Staff has attempted, however this request has not been granted. The attached Lake Oswego and West Linn library service area maps show those cities as the library service providers for both the referenced areas east of 65th Avenue (the Clackamas County boundary). See maps within Attachment A.

 The direct financial consequence of not being shown as the library service provider is that the Tualatin will not receive reimbursement for the unincorporated population within the area immediately east of Tualatin, instead it will go to Lake Oswego and West Linn.

ALTERNATIVES TO RECOMMENDATION:

The Council could choose not to participate in the Proposed Library District.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The formation of the Proposed Library District would create a permanent tax rate of thirty-nine cents (\$.3974) per one thousand dollars of assessed valuation for Clackamas County property owners.

The Average Assessed Value of residential properties in the Clackamas County part of Tualatin is \$250,000 (the average Real Market Value is \$460,000). Therefore, a home with an assessed value of \$250,000 would pay about \$99 in the first year.

Revenues generated by the Proposed Library District would be distributed to participating cities based on a formula that would return the taxes collected from the assessed value of each city plus a pro-rata share of the taxes collected from

unincorporated areas included in each library service area as defined on maps attached to the Cooperative Intergovernmental Agreement. It is proposed that the distribution formula be evaluated in 2014 and every three years thereafter.

Tualatin is projected to receive approximately \$137,000 in FY 2009-2010 as reimbursement of the taxes collected on the assessed value within Tualatin in the first year the permanent rate would be levied, and a similar amount annually adjusted for changes in assessed value subject to the City agreeing to provide library service that meets or exceeds the Oregon Library Association Standards listed in the Cooperative Intergovernmental Agreement.

Tualatin would not receive any funding for the unincorporated population within the aforementioned area east of Tualatin since the cities of Lake Oswego and West Linn have been the designated library service providers for this area under the Proposed Library District.

The County will provide capital fund grants to each city for the purpose of capital improvements or collection development. Funding for the capital grants will come from the County re-directing library operating revenue. Tualatin would receive a one-time allocation of \$150,000 in FY 2013-2014. All the other cities within Clackamas County will receive capital grants of \$1,000,000 before Tualatin receives its grant, including Estacada with a population less than the population of the Clackamas County residents of Tualatin. See the Capital Fund Chart on page 2 of the Cooperative Intergovernmental Agreement.

The attached resolution authorizes a one-time contribution to Clackamas County for the purpose of disseminating information about the Proposed Library District. The funds have not been budgeted and a transfer from the General Fund Contingency will be follow at a later date, if Council chooses to participate in the Proposed Library District.

Dear Mayor and City Councilors:

Over the past few years, Clackamas County has been engaged in a dialogue with our cities regarding the creation of a stable funding source for libraries. The County General Fund has been the source for the majority of library funding for several years. Beginning in 2007 the financial position of the County has changed dramatically. There is a pending reduction or possible elimination of the Federal Secure Rural Schools funding and we have encountered other urgent issues such as creating more detention capacity. As a result the Board of County Commissioners has had to make some difficult prioritization decisions.

Beginning July of 2009, the three County operated libraries will no longer receive General Fund support, and the County contributions to city libraries will be reduced by approximately 20%. The County General Fund contributions to city libraries will continue to reduce for the following four fiscal years until General Fund support is eliminated in June 2014. The County General Fund will continue to support the Library Network operation at its present level, and be adjusted for inflation.

It is important to note that although funding to the County libraries will be eliminated, the service areas and residents supported by those libraries will be provided for through the gained efficiency and consolidation of library operations. An example of these efficiencies would be a new and enlarged facility anticipated for the Gladstone and Oak Lodge service areas.

The Board of County Commissioners requested that staff work with the cities and the Library Network Intergovernmental Board (LNIB) to develop a plan for a county wide service district to give the citizens of the county the opportunity to continue library services.

Based on input from staff and LNIB, the Board of County Commissioners is proposing formation of a county wide library district for the November 2008 ballot. The district will include any city that adopts a resolution and intergovernmental agreement to join the district. The tax rate for the district will be 39 cents per thousand dollars of assessed value. A rate of \$.39 per thousand will allow every city that provides library service to achieve the Oregon Library Association's "threshold" level of service.

If the library service district is successful, the county will continue to provide the network services for the cities and will create a capital improvement fund for library improvements from the funds slated for operations from 2010-2014. This will provide approximately \$1,000,000 to each of the cities that provide library services in Clackamas County.

Enclosed in this packet is a draft resolution for inclusion in the service district. Each city must sign a resolution to be included within the district. There is also a draft intergovernmental agreement that lays out distribution formulas, service area boundaries, service requirements, a contribution to an information campaign and capital improvement plans.

The County would like to have a representative meet with your city council in January to discuss the proposal and answer questions. Our staff will contact you shortly to make arrangements.

We are looking forward to proceeding with the district and hope that you are as excited as we are to give the citizens of Clackamas County the chance to support and enhance their library services.

COOPERATIVE INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CLACKAMAS COUNTY LIBRARY SERVICE DISTRICT; CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON; THE CITY OF

This agreement, made this day of , is entered into by and between Clackamas County Library Service District (District) a district formed under ORS Chapter 451, Clackamas County (County), and the City of , (City) pursuant to the provisions of the Intergovernmental Cooperation Act, ORS

The District, County, and City agree to the following:

A. DISTRICT

- 1. This contract shall commence on July 1, 2009 and renew annually thereafter, unless terminated by either the City or District according to the termination provisions outlined in this contract.
 - 2. The Board of County Commissioners is the governing body of the Clackamas County Library Service District and shall be known as the District Board. The District Board shall organize a District Advisory Board and appoint one member from each participating city. The District Board shall appoint the individual nominated by the City Council to fill the City's representative seat unless there is good cause for rejecting the nomination.
 - 3. Revenues generated by the District tax base, including delinquent taxes, shall be distributed by the County Treasurer to the City and other participating cities as outlined in Attachment A for use in providing countywide cooperative library services. The formula will be evaluated in 2014 and every three years thereafter. The District Advisory Board will evaluate the formula and may recommend changes to the formula to the District Board for approval.

B. COUNTY

1. The County will continue to fund Library Network, a division of the Business and Community Services Department to provide county-wide library services to support the District's mission. The services provided will be capped at the 2007/2008 service level. These services are county-wide in benefit and include:

- The automated library system and related telecommunications
- Courier services
- Administration
- Database management services including creating/acquiring MARC format bibliographic records
- Inter-library loan services
- Inter and intra-regional cooperative library planning

The County is not responsible for new services added to Library Network. New or additional services will be billed back to the city or cities on separate contracts initiated as services are added.

- The District Advisory Board will be the advisory board to the County on Library Network services, priorities, budget, programs, procedures and review of the attachments A, B, and C. The District Advisory Board will draft by-laws.
- 3. Library Network will provide administrative support to the District Advisory Board and any subcommittees under the Advisory Board.
- 4. The County will provide capital funds to each city for the purpose of library construction, remodel, expansion, building and site improvements, library construction bonded debt service, and/or collection development. The City will develop a capital plan to identify the improvements to their library. The capital plan will be mutually agreed upon by both the County and the City. Invoices for the expense to implement the agreed upon capital plan will be submitted to the County for payment up to \$1,000,000 during or after the specified year in the Capital Fund Chart. Those Cities having an agreed upon plan will find an Attachment D in this agreement. Capital funds will be distributed according to the following schedule:

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C. CITY

- 1. The City will use District revenue to provide public library service, and shall expend the entire library revenue paid under this agreement in accordance with the purpose for which it was levied.
- 2. The City will retain administrative control over the library and library services in its service population. The City is responsible for developing library services based on the needs of its service population and the available revenue. The City will cooperate with the District Advisory Board. The City will cooperate with other participating cities to form standardized rules, procedures, and programs that affect the District as a whole.
- 3. The City, upon receiving District revenue, will agree to provide library service that meets or exceeds the Oregon Library Association Standards in Attachment C. Attachment C will be reviewed in 2014 and every three years thereafter. Service population will be based on figures determined annually for each public library by the District in Attachment B.
- 4. The City shall expend the capital funds for the purpose of library construction, remodel, expansion, building and site improvements, library construction bonded debt service, and/or collection development. The City will develop a capital plan to identify the improvements to their library. The capital plan will be mutually agreed upon by both the County and the City. Invoices for the expense to implement the agreed upon capital plan will be submitted to the County for payment up to \$1,000,000 during or after the specified year in the Capital Fund Chart. Those Cities having an agreed upon plan will find an Attachment D in this agreement.

D. GOVERNING LAWS

- Each party shall release, defend, indemnify and/or hold harmless the
 other, its officers, commissioners, councilors, employees, and agents,
 from and against all damages, claims, injuries, costs, or judgments that
 may in any manner arise as a result of the party's performance under this
 contract, subject to Oregon Tort claims limitations.
- 2. Disputes regarding this agreement, that cannot be resolved by respective managers, shall be first directed to each party's counsel. Failing resolution, parties shall mutually agree upon a third party mediator.
- 3. This contract shall be construed and governed in all respects in accordance with laws of the State of Oregon. Should any portion of this agreement or amendment there to be adjudged by a Court of appropriate final jurisdiction to be in violation of any local, state or federal law, then such portion or portions shall become null and void, and the balance of the agreement shall remain in effect. Both parties shall immediately

- renegotiate any part of this agreement found to be in such violation by the Court and to bring it into compliance with said laws.
- 4. This contract shall remain in effect to the end of the fiscal year in which both parties have signed and will be automatically renewed for successive one (1) year periods effective on July 1 of each year unless written notice of cancellation is given by either party to the other at least 180 days prior to the beginning of the next fiscal year.
- 5. At any time during the term of this agreement, at the request of either party to this agreement, the agreement may be formally reviewed by either or both parties and the District Advisory Board convened to discuss potential amendments. The District Advisory Board will forward a recommendation with the proposed amendment for consideration by the District Board.

Attachment A

The distribution formula is based on the following concepts:

- 1. The County Library District rate is \$0.3974 per \$1000 of assessed value.
- 2. Each year the District will receive the amount collected for the year plus the District's delinquent taxes recovered from the previous year. The collection rate is typically 95% of the total assessed amount.
- 3. The formula takes the previous year's assessed value of every City providing public library services in the County to compute the accessed value portion of the formula.
- 4. Each City's assessed value is subtracted from the total amount collected. The remaining funds are distributed, using the formula, by the percentage of unincorporated population in each City's population service area. City population service area maps are found in Attachment B.

The attached spreadsheets are examples of the distribution of funds. The spreadsheet labeled FY 2009-2010 is an estimate of the distribution formula before Gladstone/Oak Lodge and Happy Valley/Damascus libraries are constructed. The spreadsheet labeled FY 2010-2011 is an example of the distribution formula when the Gladstone/Oak Lodge and Happy Valley/Damascus libraries are open.


- 1. The maps divide Clackamas County into library service areas. These areas are based on distance, roads, rivers, travel patterns, etc. and are intended to define where people are most likely to receive library service, and to give a city the ability to meet the library threshold standards in Attachment C. Census tracts are assigned to each City's service area. Based on census data, the unincorporated population in those census tracts is used to calculate the percentage of service population. This percentage of unincorporated service population is used in the distribution formula.
- 2. Population within census tracts will be adjusted with each new census, every ten years. If any city annexes an unincorporated area, the estimated population from that area will be subtracted from the unincorporated service population since the city will now be receiving the assessed value.
- 3. Changes in the service area/unincorporated service population will be mutually agreed upon by the effected cities. The new service areas will be presented to the District Advisory Board and Attachment B will be modified to reflect the agreed upon changes. Service population changes may be made in 2014 and every three years thereafter.
- 4. For the continuation of library service to the citizens in the Oak Lodge and Clackamas Corner areas, the service population boundaries will not change until the Happy Valley/Damascus Library is open and the New Gladstone/Oak Lodge Library is open. As each new facility is opened to the public, the service population will be adjusted to the new agreed upon boundaries found in this Attachment.


































Steps to Formation of the Library District

The Library Services District ("District) would be governed by Oregon Revised Statutes 451. A brief summary of the applicable steps are as follows:

- Define the proposed District boundaries.
- Obtain resolutions from cities within the proposed District boundaries approving inclusion within the District.
- Initiate formation of the District by The Board of County Commissioners adopting a Board Order describing the district by name and boundary and holding a public hearing between 30-50 days after Board Order
- Proceed with legal steps required to place District formation on the November 2008 general election ballot
 - Election required since District is to be funded by a permanent tax rate limit for operations.
- Vote on the proposed District and tax rate of the District during the November 4, 2008 general election
- If the vote is affirmative, the Board acknowledges the vote and forms the District within 30 days after the election.
- Funding begins with the 2009/2010 tax year.

WHEREAS Clackamas County intends to form the Clackamas County Library Service District (the "Proposed Library District") under the authority of ORS 451.010(k). The Proposed Library District would have authority to fund libraries within the district., and

WHEREAS the Clackamas County Board of County Commissioners may initiate consideration of formation of the Proposed Library District by adopting an order under authority of ORS 198.835. Clackamas County would like to include the territory of the City within the boundaries of the Proposed Library District, and

WHEREAS the territory of the City may only be included within the boundaries of the Proposed Library District if we the City Council adopt a resolution consenting to inclusion of the territory within the proposed boundaries as described in the order initiating consideration of formation of the Proposed Library District, and

WHEREAS the City Council believes the Proposed Library District will be better positioned to provide fair and sustainable funding for the City's library and create a mechanism to recognize that the City's library serves residents of the county outside the City's boundary as well as City citizens. The City, County, and District will enter into an intergovernmental agreement as soon as practical upon the formation of the District, and

WHEREAS pursuant to this end, the City Council authorizes the transfer of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) to an intergovernmental fund, to be administered by Clackamas County, for the purpose of disseminating information about the Proposed Library District.

Section 1. The City of Tualatin hereby consents to the inclusion of all the territory of the City that is in Clackamas County within the proposed boundaries of the Proposed Library District, supports and approves the

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

SUBJECT:

UPDATE ON WATER ISSUES IMPACTING TUALATIN

ISSUE BEFORE THE COUNCIL:

This is an informational report on water issues that Tualatin is involved in. Council may wish to give direction on how to proceed from this point into the future.

RECOMMENDATION:

Council receives the update and gives some direction if desired on proceeding with possibility increasing the supply available form Portland.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

In 2006 Tualatin entered into a 10-year agreement with the City of Portland for the long term purchase of municipal water. At that time there were several discussions going on involving Tualatin, Tigard, Tualatin Valley Water District (TVWD), and Sherwood related to the long term supply of water for each entity. Staff will give an update on where each of these entities is going with their water supply.

There is a possibility of Tualatin changing from a 10 year agreement to a 20 year agreement. This could result in a savings of approximately \$85,000 per year in water purchase costs.

Another possibility is the potential acquisition of more capacity in the Washington County Supply Line (WCSL). This would be capacity the TVWD would not be using after they move their main supply to the Trask Tualatin system.

OUTCOMES OF DECISION:

If Council wishes to proceed on: 1) changing 10-year agreement to 20-year agreement; or 2) pursuing an agreement with TVWD for WCSL capacity, staff and Council will work on them and report back on the progress.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

None at this time.
