1. Resolution No. 598-13 Adopting the Tualatin Development Commission Budget, and Making Appropriations, for the Fiscal Year Commencing July 1, 2013

Finance Director Don Hudson presented the fiscal year 2013-2014 Tualatin Development Commission Budget. The City of Tualatin Budget Advisory Committee approved the proposed budget on May 29, 2013. The total budget for the Commission is \$5,195,215 and is divided among Economic Development Administration (\$247,935), Central Urban Renewal Projects (\$872,405), and Leveton Tax Increment District Projects (\$4,074,875).

The Commission has the ability to change the approved budget in each fund by no more than 10% of the total budget. There are two proposed adjustments to the committee approved budget. First, the Tualatin Sherwood Road Landscaping Project (CURD Projects Fund) has an outstanding claim with the vendor that will likely not be settled prior to June 30, 2013, \$79,300 is proposed to be carried over into FY 2013-2014 to pay the claim when settled. Second, \$15,000 of capital outlay funds in the Leveton Projects Fund is proposed to be added to pay for transit related signs within the district boundaries.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Annual Financial Report Contents

In accordance with Oregon Revised Statute 457.460, the City of Tualatin's Urban Renewal Agency must file an annual financial report with the Tualatin Development Commission and City of Tualatin prior to January 31st. Once the report is filed, it will be published in *The Tigard-Tualatin Times*.

The Central Urban Renewal District (CURD) and the Leveton Tax Increment District (LTID) stopped collecting revenue on June 30, 2010. The annual financial report (Attachment A) outlines:

- the remaining revenues and expenditures as expected in the Fiscal Year 2013-14 Adopted Budget; and,
- the year-end actual revenues and expenditures from Fiscal Year 2012-13.

Since both urban renewal districts stopped collecting revenue, no taxes were forgone by other taxing jurisdictions in the districts.
